Health & Safety Guidelines when visiting Brent Biennial

We look forward to welcoming you to the Brent Biennial.

Over 20 brand new artworks inspired by the cultures, places and people of Brent, taking art out of galleries and museums and into public spaces right across Brent — on buildings and billboards, in laundrettes and across 10 community and council libraries.

While visiting during this time of COVID-19, we request that everyone follows some basic guidelines and helps to keep us all safe.

Space

While visiting the artworks please ensure that you remain 2 metres apart from other people outside of your social bubble (max of 6 persons).

Transmission of the virus is most likely to happen within 2 metres, with risk increasing exponentially at shorter distances. While keeping this exact distance isn't always possible, remaining mindful of your surroundings and continuing to make space for others has a powerful impact when it comes to containing the spread.

Controlled Capacity

Many of the sites are within existing libraries that have reduced capacity at this time. Thank you for working with us and waiting, if necessary, at the venue while space becomes available for you.

Not all of the commissions require visitors to go inside the Libraries. Where you will need to visit the space Security guards or volunteers will be present to ensure social distancing is observed and to manage numbers in the building.

We are reducing the number of Brent Biennial host volunteers in each space to ensure more people can see the works, so sadly we won't be there to welcome you. However please do get in touch with us if you have any questions at hello@metrolandcultures.com.

Your time in the libraries will be limited to 1 hour (at Wembley, Kilburn, Willesden Green, Ealing Road, Harlesden and Kingsbury) and time in the Community Libraries (Preston Road, Kensal Rise, Barham Park and Cricklewood) may vary, please be considerate of others who may be waiting to come into the building.

Hands

Some of our art pieces are interactive. We ask that anyone touching any items ensures that they wash or sanitise their hands prior to touching and then immediately after touching the items. **Hand sanitizers are available at all of the libraries.**

Coronavirus can live for more than 24 hours in indoor environments. Washing your hands with soap and water for at least 20 seconds, or using hand sanitizer regularly throughout the day will reduce the risk of catching or passing on the virus.

Face

A face covering is required to enter the libraries.

Coronavirus is carried in the air by tiny respiratory droplets that carry the virus. Larger droplets can land on other people or on surfaces they touch while smaller droplets, called aerosols, can stay in the air indoors for at least 5 minutes, and often much longer if there is no ventilation. Face coverings reduce the dispersion of these droplets, meaning if you're carrying the virus you're less likely to spread it when you exhale. All of our indoor installations are subject to face covering rules.

Track and Trace

At each of the sites there will be a requirement to register for Track and Trace by providing your details via a QR code or a form to fill in. Please ensure you complete your details at these locations so that we can assist Track and Trace efforts by the NHS.
